Procedures To Be Followed For Compliance With The Provisions of ¶602 of The Discipline of the Southern Methodist Church

*¶*602 No applicant will be accepted into the clergy of the Southern Methodist Church as a lay minister, licensed minister, male or female missionary, if either spouse is divorced or has been divorced, except in the case of innocent parties who have been divorced for Scriptural cause. The General Conference Board of Ministerial Examiners shall investigate to determine if the applicant meets the aforesaid exception. After investigation and recommendation by the General Conference Board of Ministerial Examiners by the Annual Conference, the applicant may be received, provided the applicant meets all other requirements.

I. Required procedures:

- A. Applicant (The burden of proof is upon the applicant.):
 - 1. State in writing the facts that Scriptural cause existed.
 - 2. Furnish a certified copy of the divorce decree. (No decision will be made solely upon the divorce decree.)
 - 3. Furnish oral or certified written statements from two or more witnesses stating personal knowledge of the facts attesting the innocence of the divorced party. (These may include ministers, counselors or other persons having knowledge of the facts involved in the divorce proceedings.)
 - 4. Furnish any other corroborating factual or circumstantial evidence which may be helpful to the board in determining acceptability.
- B. Board of Ministerial Examiners:
 - 1. Upon receipt of an application involving the provisions of ¶602 of the *Discipline of the Southern Methodist Church*, the Board of Ministerial Examiners shall require the information specified in Section A above before the application can be considered.
 - 2. The Board of Ministerial Examiners shall not be limited to the above, but may use whatever other means it may deem necessary to complete its investigation.
